Although the chapters focus on a Latino family of four girls and their parents confronted by American culture, there are numerous opportunities for actors of all ethnicities.

About the Auditions

Preliminary auditions will consist of performing a short monologue, as well as a brief chat. Callbacks will consist of reading from the script and could also involve improvisation.

What to Prepare and How to Get Ready for Your Audition

Please prepare a comic, contemporary 60-90 second monologue.

What's a monologue?

A monologue is a speech from a play where one character speaks for an extended period of time to another character, him/herself, or the audience. Actors are asked not to select a monologue from the play for which they are auditioning.

What if I don't have a prepared monologue?

Not to worry. If you've never done this before OR found out about auditions at the last minute, you may use one of the 'generic' monologues linked at the bottom of Auditions webpage under "GENERAL AUDITION RESOURCES." Since you have limited time, do not worry about reading the play the monologue is, although that does help you prepare. Reading about the play's plot and characters online can help too.
